Good grief!, our Stage Manager for this production, Megan Davis, was not even born when I worked on the College's performance staring Sue Hess, Leland Starnes and our very own Kathy (Peters) Panchyk. Many of us have grown up with Community Players either by being an audience member or working on the productions. Our wish is to continue to grow by presenting award winning plays, new works and beloved classics to new and mature generations alike.
